REPORTS OF COMMITTEE

Ad Hoc Committee on Aggregate Industries February 21, 2008

P134-08 COUNCILLOR SINEWITZ - Reporting for the Ad Hoc Committee on Aggregate Industries - The closure committee for Aggregate Industries met on February 21. Attending that meeting was myself, Councillors Bettencourt and Garabedian. Also attending was Councillor Gamache. There were representatives from the Fire Department, the Conservation Commission and Community Development Department, also three neighbors who are on the committee attended. What I did to start this closure issue is I came up with an outline, basically as a starting point, because to come into a meeting and not know where we're going to go. So basically what the outline entailed first, what type of closure plan are we going to have, whether we're going to fill it with water, whether we're going to fill it with soil, fill it with water and soil, are we going to have recreation, is there going to be housing in there. So that's the first thing we started to get into. Further on down the line we're going to look at regulations and laws, whether they're federal, state, city. There was talk about -- not in detail, but just roughly -- about hiring an environmental consultant to oversee the project once it comes to fruition. Those issues deal with flooding, water monitoring, settling ponds, Ipswich River watershed. There's a whole slew of issues. And there's some miscellaneous: Notice of intent to close, bonding, liabilities issues, penalties for noncompliance of a closure plan, post closure monitoring plan. So those are an outline that I came up with. But the majority of the meeting we talked about was where to start, what type of a closure plan do the neighbors want, what does the city want? Some people talked about filling it with water, some people talked about a combination of fill and water. There was concerns because even though they're calling it a closure, they're still going to have an asphalt plant there. So how do you put an asphalt plant next to a huge body of water, which could be a reservoir. So there's safety issues. There's a whole a whole bunch of things. Mr. Colby from Aggregate brought up the expansion issue and he tried to link the two, but we just said, "Listen, we have to move forward here. We can't delay this anymore. Let's get on with it." And there were two motions that came out of this that I'd like to make. (Report received)

P135-08 COUNCILLOR SINEWITZ - MOVE TO request that the Community Development Department pursue acquiring copies of other types of closure plans developed with Aggregate Industries, what historical value they have to those communities, how those communities accomplished formulating those plans and what has transpired after the plans were adopted. Plans mentioned were Ashland, Revere and Quincy. (Unanimous)

P136-08 COUNCILLOR SINEWITZ - Reporting for the Ad Hoc Committee on Aggregate Industries - They were talking a lot about expansion. And finally we said to them, "Listen, if you have a plan, bring it to the full Council. We're going back and forth, so just bring it," when they do decide and that's what this motion is. (Report received)

P137-08 COUNCILLOR SINEWITZ- MOVE TO request that Aggregate Industries bring forward to the City Council their extension plans for the existing quarry. (Unanimous)

Ad Hoc Committee on Drug Education & Awareness February 28, 2008

P138-08 COUNCILLOR BETTENCOURT - Reporting for the Ad Hoc Committee on Drug Education & Awareness - There was a meeting of the Ad Hoc Committee on Drug Education & Awareness prior to this meeting. It was a brief meeting. Present were myself; committee members: Councillor Manning and Councillor Osborne; also present was Councillor Sinewitz. It was a review of some past work that we have done and also just a meeting to discuss what our goals are going forward. There were two issues that came up. One was a vote that we had made back in November of '07. Councillor Osborne had made a motion to appropriate \$8,000 to the Peabody YMCA program that's being run by the committee Why it Matters. It's an after-school program that we wanted to make a donation to. That motion had been made in November of '07. The program has started. And perhaps even Councillor Gravel might be able to explain a little bit on that. But we wanted to have a motion to release the funds to them. So Councillor Osborne made the following motion. (Report received)

P139-08 COUNCILLOR BETTENCOURT - MOVE TO authorize the release of \$8,000.00 from the Drug Foundation account to fund the continuation of the YMCA programming run under the guidance of the Why it Matters committee. (Unanimous)

P140-08 COUNCILLOR BETTENCOURT - Reporting for the Ad Hoc Committee on Drug Education & Awareness - That money was in part money that was donated to the committee by the Peabody Chamber of Commerce auction that they had held. They donated \$3,000 to our committee. We combined that with \$5,000 that we had raised, through fundraising efforts over the past couple of years, and that's what made up that \$8,000. The second motion was also by Councillor Osborne, but first let me just state that during the meeting Councillor Sinewitz had mentioned a person that he was familiar with who gives discussions on steroid abuse. That's certainly a relevant topic nowadays with all the congressional hearings with performance enhancing drugs, steroids and human growth hormone that's taking place at congress with all the professional athletes. Councillor Sinewitz had run across a gentleman who gives lectures to that effect. He's someone who was involved heavily in steroids and it had a devastating impact on him and Councillor Sinewitz wanted to bring that forward. Maybe something can be done with the athletic department over at the high school regarding setting up a speaker like that. So Councillor Osborne, with that mind, made the following motion. (Report received)

P141-08 COUNCILLOR BETTENCOURT - MOVE TO invite the athletic director of Peabody High School, Phil Sheridan, and the Health Department director, Sharon Cameron, to the next Drug Committee meeting to discuss bringing a speaker to the high school and the National Health week that I believe is coming up, which they'll also be asking for some funds for. (Unanimous)

P142-08 COUNCILLOR BETTENCOURT - Reporting for the Ad Hoc Committee on Drug Education & Awareness - We were discussing preliminarily about having another fundraiser in the summer. We've had two golf tournaments in the past. That's going to be something we possibly look at to have a third annual golf tournament or maybe some other type of fundraiser, but I want at the next meeting to start discussing some ideas. The meeting today was to kind of preliminarily start discussing those topics. (Report received)

Finance Committee **January 28, 2008**

P143-08 COUNCILLOR BETTENCOURT - Reporting for the Finance Committee - The Finance Committee met prior to this meeting also. All members of the Council were present. And voting members of the Finance Committee were myself, Councillor Sinewitz, Councillor Mello, Councillor Liacos and Councillor Gravel, but all councillors participated actively. Also present were Patty Schaffer, our finance director; Jean Delios, our Community Development director, and William Power, who is the chairman of the Community Preservation Committee. There were two items for discussion. The one was a request to appropriate \$25,000 from the operating reserve fund for repairs to fire trucks. \$25,000. \$12,700 of the amount was to be used for a transmission repair on engine five. A motion was made by Councillor Gravel and that was unanimously approved. (Report received)

P145-08 COUNCILLOR BETTENCOURT - Reporting for the Finance Committee - The second item was a discussion regarding a proposal that was brought to us by the Community Development director for the installation of 38 new windows to City Hall. The project is \$456,900. City Hall was designated a historical building back in 1975, so there are certain requirements that must be met to continue that and to receive state funding, which we may be in line for by being an historical building. There was a presentation made. Many employees of City Hall spoke about the need for these repairs. Certainly there were issues of being cold, drafts, a waste of heat, certainly it was not energy efficient -- an argument was made -- and that the windows were in just great disrepair. So there were two items and two votes had to be taken. There was a request to transfer \$256,900 from the Community Preservation fund to go towards the City Hall windows and this would be Phase II, which would take care of the second floor. The first floor had already been completed back in 2002. This was for the second floor. So there was a motion made by Councillor Gravel to authorize the appropriation of \$256,900 from the Community Preservation Committee fund to City Hall windows and that was unanimously approved five to zero. 
