Based on the noncompliance of the following sections of the Peabody Zoning Ordinance:

1. The proposed use does not meet the requirements of Section 6.1.2 Special Permit General Requirements; the use for which the permit is sought will not satisfy a desirable local need, that its design and appearance will be injurious to the established or future character of the vicinity and the neighborhood and that the proposed use is not in harmony with the general purpose and intent of the Zoning Ordinance.

2. The proposed use does not meet the requirements of Section 11.6.4 (5) as follows:

- (5) The applicant has not demonstrated that the Billboard is in harmony with or suitable for the surrounding area and would not do significant damage to the visual environment. In making this determination, the Special Permit Granting authority may consider among other factors, health, safety, general welfare of the public, the scenic beauty of the area, the physical, environmental, cultural, historical or architectural characteristics of the location and area, the structure, height, size of the sign, the number of signs on the premise and in the area where the Billboard is to be located.

By adding a new section as follows:

19-27.1 Exclusion of heavy and commercial vehicles on certain streets; exceptions
Higgins Construction Project

(a) No commercial vehicles with a capacity of 2 ½ ton or more, traveling to or from the Higgins Middle School construction project, shall enter or pass over any of the following streets or parts of streets;

Ellsworth Road; Emerson Street; King Street, Kosciusko Street; Perkins Street; Southwick Road; Thorndike Street

AND that said ordinance be adopted under an Emergency Preamble.


