The City of Peabody Health Department will be offering a Drive Through influenza vaccination clinic for residents aged 6 months and older on:

**Time: 10 am to 2pm**

Participants will stay in their car and are encouraged to pre-register for the flu clinic online prior to the event. In addition to the standard quadrivalent flu vaccine for adults and children, a limited quantity of High Dose flu vaccine will be available for people over 65 years of age, and FluMist (the intranasal version of the vaccine) will be available for children if requested.

No pets are permitted in vehicles that enter this Drive Through flu clinic so please leave animals at home. **All participants must wear masks.** Participants should bring their health insurance cards and Medicare cards if they have them. However, no participant will be turned away if uninsured or underinsured. Please wear clothing that provides easy access to your upper arm.

Individuals must not have been diagnosed with COVID-19 in the past 21 days and must not have been a close contact to a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the past 21 days. Individuals must prescreen themselves prior to attending the clinic to ensure they are free from the following symptoms:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

The Peabody Health Department encourages all Peabody residents 6 months of age and older to receive flu vaccine this fall. For questions about this flu clinic, please contact (978) 538-5926. Please note that flu vaccine is widely available this fall, and is available at many pharmacies and doctors' offices for those who do not wish to wait in line. **Participants are requested to approach the clinic from the Centennial Park/Jubilee Drive area rather than from Route 1/Forest Street in order to join the line.**
