Homeowners can celebrate the rich architectural history of Peabody with a historical marker which showcases the original date when their home was built.



Each custom-made marker will be painted with a white background and black lettering and are designed for the placement on the outside of your home.

The signage measure 12" H by 15" W. The signage is made of weatherproof MDO (medium density overlay) signboard. The signage has been finished with three coats of special sign painter's oil-based primer and an enamel topcoat. Holes are pre-drilled and screws are provided for installation.

Historical House Markers are for sale at a cost of \$125.00 through the Peabody Historical Commission. Please use the application on the back side of this brochure. Make check payable to the Peabody Historical Commission.

Who can participate in the historic maker program?

Any home in the City of Peabody, single or multiple family which was built prior to 1900 might qualify for a historic house marker.

Where do I get information on my house?

How do I order a Historic Marker?

Fill out the attached order form and include a copy of any documentation you may have, (Deed, city directory, listing, building permits, surveys etc.) establishing your house's construction date along with your check for \$125.00. If the exact date can not be determined, the word "circa" will be added as your house marker's date.

What does the House Marker say?

Each custom-made marker shows the date your home was built and includes the verbiage of the Peabody Historical Commission. If your home is located in a Historical District area, (Civic Center District or the Washington Street District), the wording will be added to your marker.

How long does it take to produce each marker?

It will generally take up to 3-4 weeks.

You will be notified by phone and/or email when your house marker is ready for pick up.

Where should I place my Historical House Marker?

The house marker should be place on the outside of your home, at eye level, facing the street. If architectural features or landscaping make that impracticable, house marker's may be mounted at higher levels.

If my marker is damaged, lost or stolen can I order a replacement marker?

Yes, replacement markers will be available at the owner's expense \$125.00
