REPORTS OF COMMITTEE

Finance Committee **December 12, 2019**

P840-19 COUNCILLOR GRAVEL – Reporting for the Finance Committee – This evening we had my last Finance Committee meeting and present at the meeting on behalf of the Finance Committee were myself, Councillor McGinn, Councillor Rossignoll, Councillor Manning-Martin, and Councillor Gould; and also present were all other councillors. There were basically four agenda items. The primary agenda item that was discussed as the first part of the meeting was the request from the Peabody Retirement Board to increase the COLA base from \$12,000 to \$13,000. After some discussion it was realized that, one, we haven't changed a COLA base since 2010 and, two, a majority of the cities that are allowed to change the COLA base had already exceeded 13. Through further discussion it was noted that a more appropriate number might be \$15,000 so a vote was taken and the subcommittee agreed to move the COLA base to \$15,000. To translate that for people who might not have seen the earlier meeting, that means that roughly \$7.50 extra per month for a retiree. We did have one member of the Retirement Board, as well as Mr. Freeman, here presenting on behalf of the Retirement Board. That doesn't equate to a heck of a lot, but certainly would be appreciated. I think whatever we can do for our retirees. (Report received)

Said allowance is a local option and has been included in the legislation as a part of the Acts of 2010 approved by the governor and the state legislature.

Mr. Gingras was here to talk to us about two reports that are produced. One report was the closeout report for the last fiscal year ending June 30, 2019, of which he pointed out that there was actually a balance of funds left in the budget in the amount of \$904,464.20, which made its way back to the reserve and then through the recent tax classification we moved that money back to offset tax increases on residents and commercial. So that was a report of progress. After that we got a status of appropriations from July 1 to November 27. We went through several line items and there were some items, kind of, put on watch, but other than that everything seems to be running consistent with the budget and the future council will continue to look at that, as suggested, on a monthly basis so that they can keep control and understanding in terms of where our status of funds are. So that was a report of the progress. A point of information was we received the Public Employee Retirement Administration Commission's report of appropriations for Fiscal Year '21 and that report was to advise that there would be a roughly \$700,000 increase in the appropriation required for the retirement board.


